#### Student Athletes: What Parents Need to Know

Preparing your student athlete for college requires planning. Learn what it takes to make your student athlete successful in the classroom so they can continue to play the sport they love.

## **Counting Your Money and Making Your Money Count**

Participants will discuss the various aspects of a budget and will be given resources to make their own financial future a success.

## Credit Repair 101: Achieving the Goal of Financial Stability

Participants will discuss strategies and practical techniques for establishing good credit, repairing bad credit and achieving financial stability.

## College Readiness: Preparing Your Child for College

College can be a reality for all students. This session will provide participants with information around ensuring that their child is ready — academically and financially for college.

## **Helping Boys Succeed in School**

"Boys will be boys!" Participants will discuss ways to use the natural interests of boys to keep them interested and engaged in academics.

## Just Say Know - Talking to your children about drugs and alcohol

It is never too early to start talking to your children about the dangers of drugs and alcohol. Drugs are being found in *elementary* schools around America. This workshop will help you to present the facts and dangers of these drugs to your children. Participants will be given tools to discuss the topic of drugs and alcohol with their children.

## Saving for College

Saving for a child's college is quite a task. Learn the various alternatives available, along with the advantages and disadvantages of each. Participants will discuss 529 plans, prepaid tuition, life insurance, and personal saving and investments strategies.

## Social Networking 101

Participants will explore the pros & cons and ins & outs of sites such as Facebook, MySpace, Twitter, Linked In, and even a few blog sites. Whether you want to keep in touch with your family and friends across the country, are trying to track down old friends from high school, networking for a job, or following your favorite celebrities - there's a networking tool out there to help you do just that! And it's not complicated!

## **Bullying**

This session will present an overview of the CCSD Bullying Policy and provide helpful information on how to recognize, define, and prevent bullying.

#### **Gang Awareness**

Participants will discuss the warning signs that may indicate a child is involved in gang activity and strategies to help children stay away from gangs.

#### Understanding and Addressing Barriers of Families in the Community

Participants will engage in activities that will help them understand the struggles that families with language poverty barriers face in order to engage and work with students and their families in a more effective manner. "Families" will be given various situations and they must figure out how to provide for basic necessities and shelter.

#### **Becoming your Child's Most Effective Advocate**

Strong advocacy skills are critical as you work to ensure your child benefits from his/her education. Learn the steps to help you effectively advocate for your child's needs. Remember, you are an equal partner in your child's education.

## How You Say it Matters in Language Development, Literacy and Student Achievement

Everything is casual in today's society - including the way we speak. Unfortunately, our students are experiencing the effects of casual conversation in their schoolwork and their ability to communicate. Participants will learn how language development is related to student achievement and will discuss strategies to improve the language development of their students.

## ADHD - (Part I & Part II)

Participants will review the rights of a child with ADD/ADHD, become familiar with classroom accommodations and discuss behavior management techniques.

## Understanding the IEP process and your child's rights (Part I & Part II)

Participants will become familiar with special education terms, the IEP process and parents' rights.

#### Homework without the Headache

Participants will discuss common homework frustrations and will examine strategies to help their child complete homework without the anxiety or frustration.

## **Understanding State Assessments**

Participants will review the components of the MAP and PASS assessments and discuss strategies to help their child prepare for the tests.

#### Getting Ready for Parent Conferences - Effective Communication

Participants will review and discuss effective questions to ask teachers at conferences to get a good idea of their student's academic progress. Participants will also evaluate their current communication skills and discuss techniques to become more effective in communication.

## How to Help your Elementary School Child in Reading

Participants will discuss various strategies and techniques to help young children learn to read and to understand what they are reading.

## How to Help your Elementary School Child in Writing

Participants will discuss various writing styles and tips to help young children develop writing skills necessary for elementary school assignments.

#### Helping your Elementary School Child in Math

Participants will review the topics covered in elementary school and will discuss strategies to help children develop math skills.

## How to Help your Middle School Child in Reading

Participants will discuss various strategies and techniques to help middle school aged children continue to develop literacy skills necessary in middle school grades.

#### How to Help your Middle School Child in Writing

Participants will review various writing styles and grammar and discuss tips to help middle school students develop writing skills necessary for middle school.

## Helping your Middle School Child in Math

Participants will review the math principles covered in middle school and will discuss strategies to implement at home to help their child develop math skills.

#### Reclaiming our Daughters

Unwed mothers. Abortions. Rape. Struggles that our daughters face are real and negative. Participants will discuss ways to turn the statistics around and prepare their daughters to face the world with optimism.

## Surviving a Step-Family
